WATKINS STAINED GLASS

Stained glass has been in the Watkins' family for about two hundred years according to records in Liverpool, England. Clarence Watkins came to Denver, Colorado in about 1869 and almost starved to death in the first years; eventually he made an amazing number of church and home windows. His grandson remembers his collecting one outstanding bill from a Soda Fountain Co. with his 44 Colt pistol. During the 20's his son, Frank, rode the stained glass boom until the depression—at that time twenty-five stained glass glaziers worked where he did in Denver. Present generation Phil Watkins has been a member of the Stained Glass Association for sixteen years. With him in the studio is his son, Phil, and his wife, formerly Alice Alter, who worked at Lamb's and Rambusch Studios.

A very few of our installations are Divine Redeemer Catholic, Colorado Springs; Bethlehem & St. Mark's Lutheran, Denver; Mount Sinai Synagogue, Cheyenne, Wyoming; and Petroleum Club bar, Denver.
